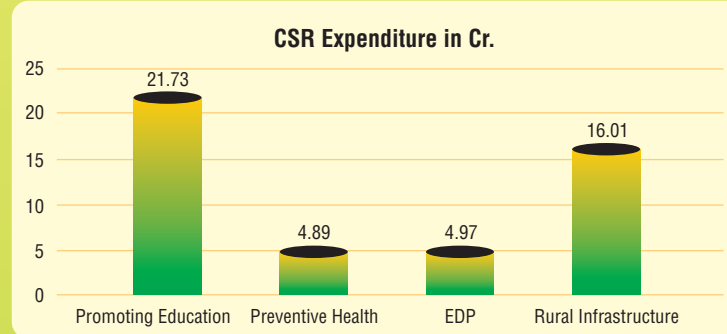


## Driving Force

- Books and educational aids

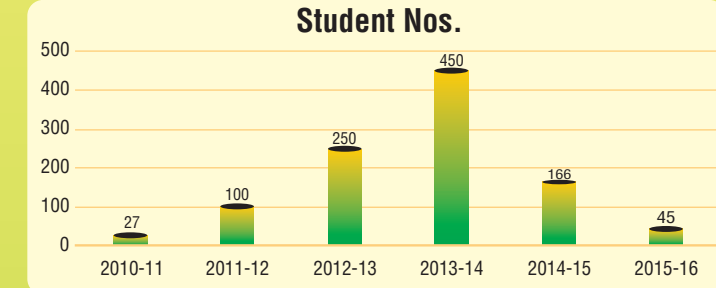
